A Book of Remembrance

Today, we will once again be discussing a very important crossroad that we all have faced: the crossroad of doubt. I hope that you have brought your Bible with you so we can study this subject together.

The other day I was reading a book on the importance of prayer in the Christian's life. In one of his chapters, the author mentioned the importance of keeping a prayer journal. He kept a record of answered prayers and special blessings in a little black book. After a move to a different ministry, he misplaced the book but found it again several years later at a time when his faith was floundering. He was surprised that he had forgotten most of the incidents about which he had written. As he began to read, he said, “My memory of God's faithfulness was revived and my sagging faith began to recover. Remembering had restored my confidence in the Lord.” Have you ever considered keeping a book of remembrance like this author does? In this book you will commit to recording God's answered prayers on a daily basis. It may mean “the difference between victory and defeat”, he said.

We find an example of this in Psalm 77. The writer's faith was also floundering. After listing his doubts, he asked, “Has God forgotten to be gracious?” (verse 9). Next, he said, “I will remember the years of [God] right hand... I will remember the work of the Lord; surely I will remember Your wonders of old” (verses 10-11). This is a wonderful way to revive your faith in your moment of need. Why not take a moment before or after worship today and read the rest of the verses in this chapter (77).

Something else you can easily do is create your own book of remembrance, and record God's activities each day. Then read it daily, especially on days of doubt.
